Topic of the Month: Winter Conditions. It's the that time of year when we should start planning for working in inclement weather

Ice, Frost and Snowy Conditions

To reduce the risk of slips on ice, frost or snow, we should be considering the risk and put in a system to manage it.

Ensure that all entrances and footpaths are free of snow and ice



Look at your building entrances, car parks, pedestrian walkways, shortcuts, sloped areas and areas constantly in the shade or wet and *act* to reduce the risks whenever freezing temperatures are forecast.

Implement a procedure to prevent an icy surface forming and inform staff about the importance dressing appropriately and reporting safety issues. Use grit or similar, on areas prone to be slippery in frosty, icy conditions; Divert pedestrians to less slippery walkways and barrier off existing ones.

Drinking/Drugs and Driving:

These are not compatible so don't do it. Don't risk your licence or your life

Winter Driving

Prepare your vehicle

It's a good idea to have the vehicles fully serviced before winter starts and have the anti-freeze tested. If you can't have it serviced, then do your own checks

In particular, check:

- 1. Lights are clean and working
- 2. That the battery is fully charged
- That the windscreen, wiper blades and other windows are clean, and the washer bottle filled with screen wash
- 4. That you have a flashlight/torch
- 5. That you have a blanket in the car
- 6. Carry water and maybe some snacks
- Tyre condition, tread depth and pressure (of all the tyres, including the spare)
- 8. That the brakes are working well
- That the Fluids are kept topped up, especially windscreen wash (to the correct concentration to prevent it freezing), anti-freeze and oil
